She wants people to enjoy art daily and for it to be more accessible.









A mural is a large piece of art work on a wall either inside or outside

That shape, line, form, tone, pattern and texture are all important in making a piece of art.

To know what shape, line, form, tone, pattern and texture mean when we talk about a picture or piece of art.

The three primary colours are red, blue and yellow. (Revisited knowledge)

That primary colours can be mixed to create secondary colours.

Townscape	A picture of a town and buildings.		
Mural - a large painting on a wall or ceiling.		Canvas - a stretched piece of material for painting on.	
Primary and Secondary Colours		Shading	
Pastels - coloured sticks of either oil or chalk		Cross Hatching - using lines that go across each other to show texture or light or dark.	
Palette - a tray to mix paints on.		Stipple - dots placed to make texture or light or dark.
