Famous for: The Great Wave off Kanagawa - a wood block print.

- He lived about 200 years ago.
- He started painting when he was about 6.
- When he was 12 he went to work in a book shop.
- When he was 18 he went to learn to be a wood carver.
- He was famous for his woodblock prints.
- His most famous print is called The Great Wave off Kanagawa.



Primary Colours		Rubbing	
Secondary Colours		Stamping	
Ink		Cross Hatching - using lines that go across each other to show texture or light or dark.	
Printing Block - a block made to press into the ink and then onto paper.		Printing with a cut out shape on the end of something like a potato or a block of wood.	
Roller			
Mono Print - using one colour.		Drawing into the ink. Lay the paper on top and rub over.	
Pattern - repeated marks		Roll out the ink and lay the paper on the top and then draw a design on the paper.
