



The Torah Scroll is a holy object, the divine word of God, a rule book, a guide, a source of inspiration and much more. The 2 wooden rollers used to support the scroll are referred to as the 'Tree of Life.'



The first five books of the Tanakh collectively known as the Torah. These books are Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy.

The Torah scrolls are written in Hebrew by a Sofer (scribe).

Old Testament- the first part of the Bible, comprising of thirty-nine books

New Testament- the second part of the Christian Bible, written originally in Greek and recording the life and teachings of Christ and his earliest followers.

Gospel- 'Good News' the record of Christ's life and teaching in the first four books of the New Testament.

Word of God- The Bible is believed to be the inspired word of God that is flawless and equips the believer.

Translation- the process of translating words or text from one language into another.
