Hanukkah- Jewish festival lasting eight days.

Dreidel- a small four-sided spinning top with a Hebrew letter on each side, used in a children's game traditionally played at the Jewish festival of Hanukkah

Hanukkiyah - is a candelabra designated specifically for the Hanukkah candles.



God - Creation - Fall - People of God - INCARNATION - Gospel - SALVATION - Kingdom of God

Hanukkah is an important Jewish festival of light.

Light is used as a metaphor to describe Jesus and his impact on the world.

The light of Jesus brings hope in dark places.

Originating in Germany the Christingle is used in many church services to celebrate Jesus as the Light of the World. Christingles are oranges wrapped in red tape, decorated with dried fruit or sweets, with a candle on the top.



Christingle- a candle in an orange symbolising Christ as the light of the world

Light of the World- a phrase Jesus used to describe himself and his disciples in the New Testament

Saviour- Jesus Christ is the redeemer of sin

Incarnation- God in human form

Jerusalem- a holy city in Israel

Temple- the Temple was the central place of worship for the Jewish people
