Temple - a building for religious worship.

Menorah - a candelabrum used in Jewish worship, especially one with eight branches.

Not all church buildings are the same but have similar features according to denomination.

Christianity is a world-wide multi-cultural faith.

People of other faiths have different places of worship and I can name the buildings, key features and the worship that takes place there.

Church- a building for Christian worship.

Chapel- a small building or room used for Christian worship in a school, prison, hospital, or large private house.

Cathedral- the principal church of a diocese, with which the bishop is officially associated.

Vicar- Vicar is the title given to certain parish priests in the Church of England.

Curate- priests (or, in the first year, transitional deacons) who are in their first post after ordination (usually for four years), and are completing their training.

Minister- a minister is a person authorized by a church or other religious organization to perform functions such as teaching of beliefs; leading services such as weddings, baptisms or funerals; or otherwise providing spiritual guidance to the community.


3 Jewish symbols commonly found in a Synagogue
