Here are a few ways you can help your child learn some of the key knowledge and Key vocabulary from their KEYS sheet. These are only suggestions for you to try at home. We don't expect you to do them all in one go but you can choose one or two when you are asked to learn something from your KEYS sheets.

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| <p><u>Picture</u> Draw a picture to represent your knowledge.</p> | <p><u>Paperchain</u> Make a paper chain with facts written on each chain.</p> | <p><u>Tweet</u> Write a summary, in less than 20 words, to 'tweet to your teacher'.</p> | <p><u>Poster</u> Re-design your knowledge organiser for a different age group.</p> | <p><u>Glossary</u> Re-write or draw your vital vocabulary in a different way.</p> |
| <p><u>Research</u> Research your topic on the computer or using books.</p> | <p><u>Debate</u> Have a debate about your topic with another class member or relative.</p> | <p><u>Memorise</u> Find a way to remember the key facts and Key vocabulary.</p> | <p><u>Mind Map</u> Create a diagram with facts.</p> | <p><u>Fill The Gaps</u> Create an activity where you fill in the blanks.</p> |
| <p><u>Highlight</u> Write out the fact and highlight the key words.</p> | <p><u>Family Quiz</u> Ask a family member or friend to quiz you on what you have learnt.</p> | <p><u>Drama</u> Use drama activities to show your understanding. E.g. act out the water</p> | <p><u>Flashcards</u> A summary of a key fact. Definition of a key word.</p> | <p><u>Essay</u> Write a written piece of work to explain the things you have learnt.</p> |
