Pronunciation tips



'h' is silent. **H**ola (ola)  
'e' as **ay** ¿Cómo **tay** llamas?  
'u' as **oo**. Buenos- **boo**-**aynos** (b**waynos**)  
**nueve** - **noo**-**ayvay** (n**wayvay**)  
**luego** - **loo**-**aygo** (l**waygo**),  
'z' as **th** eg, diez (di**ayth**)  
'ny' as **ny** eg, mañana (m**anyana**)  
'c' before an 'i' or 'e' as **th** eg. **cero**, **thero**  
'll' as **y** eg me **llamo** (m**ay yamo**)
