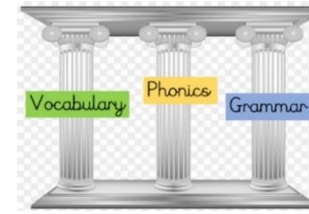

We already know that there are 2 different words for **a** in Spanish. Now let's look at the different words used for the word **the** when talking about singular nouns.

| A (Indefinite article) | | THE (Definite article) | |

| MASCULINE NOUNS | | | |
| un plátano | a banana | el plátano | the banana |
| un limón | a lemon | el limón | the lemon |
| un melón | a melon | el melón | the melon |
| FEMININE NOUNS | | | |
| una manzana | an apple | la manzana | the apple |
| una pera | a pear | la pera | the pear |
| una ciruela | a plum | la ciruela | the plum |

Now for plurals Add **s** or **es** to make most nouns plural. Change the word **the** as follows.

el → los (masculine)

On Friday 5 oranges.



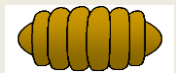
¡El sábado come demasiado!
