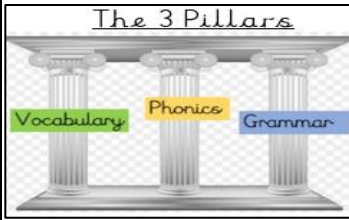

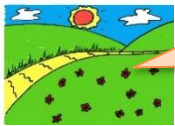

Singular (feminine) Plural

the crisp
La patata frita



a crisp
una patata frita

the crisps
Las patatas fritas



some crisps
unas patatas fritas

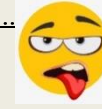
