

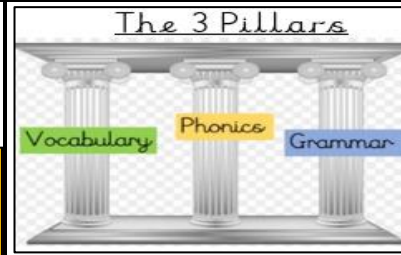

With jugar we need to use the word 'al'.

## hacer (verb 'to do')

hacer ciclismo 	hacer baile 	hacer footing 	hacer natación 	hacer gimnasia 
--------------------	-----------------	-------------------	--------------------	--------------------

With hacer we don't need to use the word 'al'.
