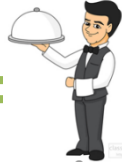




We already know how to ask politely for things.

Tapas

In Spanish **una tapa** means a cover or lid. Many years ago people used to put a small saucer or a piece of bread over their glass of wine, to stop flies getting in. Wine bars started to put small bits of food on the saucer or bread to attract more customers. Over time bars became more adventurous with these small food items and this has evolved into the larger tapas portions we have today.
