



Knowledge

- We have five senses: sight, hearing, touch, taste, and smell.
- Senses send messages to our brain so we understand what is happening.

Sight

Our eyes use light to help us see.



Taste

The top surface of the tongue is covered in taste buds. We can taste four separate flavours; sweet, salt, bitter and sour.



Touch

The organ used for touch is our skin and it covers our whole body. The sense of touch allows us to tell if something is hot or cold, dull or sharp, rough or smooth or wet or dry.



Smell

We can use our nose to smell things. Our sense of smell can also warn us about possible dangers, for example if we smell smoke.



Taste buds - sensory organs found on your tongue.

Sound waves - sound is made of vibrations.

Pupil - part of an eye that light enters.

Iris - coloured part of the eye.

Hygiene - keeping your body clean and healthy.

Enquiry - scientific test or investigation.

Observe - looking or watching something carefully.

Hearing

Our ears help us to hear. Sounds travel through our ears to send messages to our brain.
